**Distribution**: Native to Central America but introduced and naturalized in tropical South and Southeast Asia including India

**Description**: Herb with tuberous fusiform roots, opposite leaves, winged petioles, stem 4-angled, flowers violet

**Phytochemicals**: Leaves contain apigenin, luteolin, while myristic, capril and lauric acid. Presence of tannin, flavonoid, steroid, triterpnoid and phenol also reported.

**Medicinal/economic uses**: Used as anthelmintic, abortifacient, blood cleansing, antimicrobial, antifungal, insecticidal; in treating joint pains, bladder disease, kidney disease, whooping cough, and joint pains (roots and leaves).used as diuretic, antidiabetic, antipyretic, analgesic, anti-hypersensitive, thirst-quenching, and antidotal agent.
