Common name: Woolly rattle pod, Shakeshake

Family: Fabaceae (Leguminosae)

Habitat: Terrestrial

Distribution: Pantropical, sub-tropical; invasive and noxious in introduced regions including USA (https://www.invasive.org)

Description: Erect, often bushy shrub; stems hairy; leaves 3-foliolate; leaflets broad-obovate to broad-elliptic, upper surface glabrous, lower surface sparsely hairy; stipules filiform; flowers yellow arranged in racemes-10-flowered; pedicellate; bracts and bracteoles linear; corolla yellowish with reddish brown markings; wings and keel equal; keel incurved in lower half, beak long, not twisted; placentation marginal; fruit-pod long, hairy

Phytochemicals: Steroid β - sitosterol, and 1-nonadecanol, alkaloids, phenols, terpenoids, flavonoids, anthraquinones

Medicinal/Economic uses: Antibacterial. Used as traditional folk medicine as purgative, astringent, in treating jaundice and palpitation, inflammation, skin disease.
