**Common name** : Floss Flower, Blue mink, Mexican paintbrush

**Family** : Asteraceae (Compositae)

Habitat : Terrestrial

**Distribution** : Native to Mexico, parts of USA; garden escape in UK, and becomes invasive; alien and invasive in Indian Himalayas with high allelopathic potential

**Description** : An annual branched semi-erect herb; leaves oval to heart-shaped; flowers purple to blue to lavender or pink, arranged in capitula, ray florets are thread like; anthers syngenesious; fruits cypsela with pappus

**Phytochemicals**: 2,6-octadien-1-ol, phenol, ethanone, hexadecanoic acid, acetyllycopsamine, squalene, stigmasterol

**Medicinal/Economic uses** : Antimicrobial, antioxidant, antifungal, anti-ulcer, antidiabetic, anti-inflammatory. Juice of the plant is used externally to treat cuts and wounds. Insecticide. May cause skin problems and hepatoxic.
