**Description** : Climber/creeper bushy; The thorn is stiff. Branches and inflorescences perpendicular to the trunk. Soft branches are short, light brown, dense; leaves simple, alternate, ovate-lanceolate, acute at apex, entire at margin, cuneate to tapering at base; flowers small, bouquet branching; perennial petal, perpendicular to the small white flowers; the base of the petals; the base is small, very short brown hairs petals, petals 4, very cone-shaped cone. At the end of the split, four stamens are longer than the petals, about 2 times smaller than the smaller stamens. Female stigma splits into two lobes
